4a Policy 8101 Academic Programs and Policy 8102 Credential and Credit Standards

Information

Two new policies were created from the one Policy 8100. These updates have been coming for a long time.

Changes when Policy 8101 is approved will be effective August 1, 2023. Some additions to the policy are purpose, scope, principles and, definitions. There is a summary of principles, roles and responsibilities, and a workflow included for each section of development and changes of programs or courses.

The workflows still have some glitches. These will be worked out before the final copy is distributed to the council. If anyone notices anything amiss with them please email Sarah or Natasha.

Policy 8602 Credential, Recognition, and Credit Standards

The tuition policy created the need to separate set tuition programs from cost recovery programs.

There are three parts to the definitions section: general, credentials, and recognition.

The instructional components are clearly defined for credit and non-credit courses. It was noted that the definition for Seminar hours was missing from the new policy.

Mode of delivery was defined as per the language developed by the Teaching and Learning Centre. Examples of what a typical credential could be found in the Credential Standards appendix. Newly added was a recognition table.

If any credits need to be rounded then a variance needs to be submitted and approved by EdCo. The goal of this policy was to make it very clear and easy to understand so that it is more helpful to its users.

Policy 8102 will need to be approved by the Board.

The definition section is a great addition. It was noted that the principles section should be the same or similar to Policy 8101.

Workload will not be included in this policy.

NEW PROGRAM PROPOSAL –Two-year Post-Graduate Program in Full Stack Web Development

The anticipated start date for this program is 2024. It was asked if there was consideration given to adding a co-op component to the program?
