# Co-op Employer Guide

## What is Co-op Education?

A collaboration between students, employers and postsecondary institutions providing students with short-term employment in a field related to their studies.

#### What qualifies as a Co-op job?

A paid, full-time position consisting of approximately 12 weeks or 420 hours that takes place during an academic semester (May-Aug/Sept-Dec/Jan-Apr). The position engages the employee in productive work and learning opportunities relevant to their program of study.

## What are the benefits of hiring a co-op student?

- Access to a year-round supply of highly motivated and capable students from many disciplines to perform specific tasks/projects.
- Test out Co-op Education hires as possible future employees.
- Take advantage of wage subsidies to cover a large portion of the employee's wage and/or training costs.

- Receive optional support from the CEES team including:
  - job posting
  - recruitment
  - collecting resumes
  - arranging & accommodating interviews
  - notifying successful & unsuccessful applicants
  - student-employer relations.

#### Process Map of the Co-op Experience


The process of hiring a co-op student may vary with each employer, position and student. Here is an example:

# When should I start the process of hiring a co-op student?

It's never too early to start the process and we recommend at least three to four months before the start date. Some wage subsidy programs, such as Columbia Basin Trust, start receiving applications as early as three months before the beginning of the work term. As well, students who are keen to get a co-op position, often start their job search at the beginning of the previous semester. Having said that, CEES is here to support you at any point and will help you fill your co-op position up until the start of the work-term.
