

Study Permit Extension + Co-op Work Permit Application Guidance

Can I submit a study permit extension together with a Co-op work permit application?

Study permit extension and Co-op work permit applications can be submitted together. There is an application fee for study permit extension (\$150). The co-op work permit is free, and you do not need a job offer to apply.

You must have a valid study permit when you submit your application. The co-op work permit is usually issued for the length of your new study permit.

Your co-op work permit will list the employer as “Selkirk College” and will allow you to work full-time as long as the work is part of your program requirements.

Study permit extension and Co-op work permit applications can be submitted together. There is an application fee for study permit extension (\$150). For Study Permit Extension, you will need to order the study permit renewal support letter from <https://forms.selkirk.ca/view.php?id=391843>

need to extend your study permit, please request an extension letter from <https://forms.selkirk.ca/view.php?id=391843>

- **Provincial Attestation Letter**

No need if you are applying for a study permit extension at the same DLI **and** level of study as your current study permit. Please choose you are exempted from it and provide proof: combine your study permit with your rental agreement and receipts from local businesses such as grocery stores.

- **Medical Exam:**

If your practicum is related to health care, child care, you will need an upfront medical exam, which can cost you more than \$300.

Note: There is a temporary public policy for medical exam until Oct.5, 2029, if you completed an IME within 5 years of submitting your new application, include the IME number or the confirmation you received from your previous medical exam in your current application. You may be exempt from completing another IME if you meet all of these conditions:

- **you applied or are applying for either permanent residence or temporary residence**
- **you already live in Canada**
- **you completed your previous IME in the last 5 years**
- **your previous IME indicated a low risk or no risk to public health or public safety**

You must undergo an immigration medical exam if Immigration Officer requires later.

- **Financial Requirements**

You must prove that you are financially admissible to work in Canada.

As of Jan 1, 2024, the minimum cost-of-living financial requirement has increased to **\$20,635** for 2024 (for a single applicant). This amount will be adjusted annually based on **Statistics Canada's low-income cut-off (LICO)**. You can find international tuition details for your program on our website.

◆ **As a student, you must demonstrate funds covering:**

- ✓ One-year **tuition fees**
- ✓ **Cost of living** (\$20,635 for 2024)

Apply to come to Canada

Includes applications for visitor visas, work and study permits, Express Entry and International Experience Canada. You will need your personal reference code if you have one.

Note: You **must** apply through this portal (IRCC secure account) if you're applying with a family member who needs a work permit.

Refugees: Apply for temporary health care benefits

Use this application if you are a protected person or refugee claimant who wants to apply for the Interim Federal Health Program.

Citizenship: Apply for a search or proof of citizenship

Use this application to apply for proof of citizenship (citizenship certificate) or to search citizenship records.

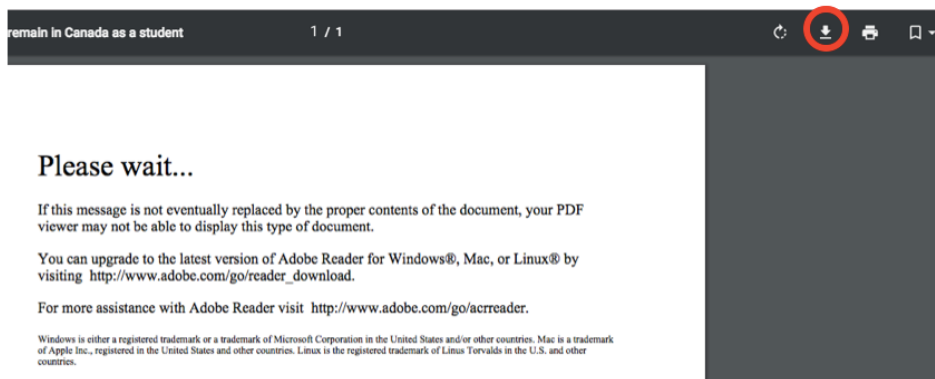
Versions of application forms for study permits dated November 2023 (11-2023), applications forms to change conditions, extend your stay or remain in Canada as a student dated January 2024 (01-2024), work permits dated November 2013 (11-2013), or later, and applications for temporary resident visas dated March 2014 (03-2014), or later, can only be uploaded to the IRCC Portal.

Note: You are responsible for ensuring that the documents you submit are correct. Carefully review the documents you have attached to this application. A decision concerning your application will be made based upon the information you submit. You will not be able to make changes to your application once it has been submitted. Please ensure that you scan and attach all relevant documents to your online submission. Any documents received by mail related to this application will not be considered.

Application Form(s)

- Download the application form and save it on your computer. Ensure that you have a **latest version of Adobe Reader** to open and fill out the form. If you don't have this software, please use the computer in the college library to fill out the form and upload in your IRCC secure account.

If you see a "Please wait..." message when trying to download an IRCC form, click on the **download arrow** at the top right to save the file onto your computer. Then open it with Adobe Reader. (If you don't see the arrow, move your cursor to the top part of the screen and it will appear.)

3. Upload documents by following the instructions. **If you hope to know the requirements of the document, just click the question mark “?” .**

Just a kind reminder that the passport scanned copy would need your biographical page and all your stamped pages and the pages with any visa. Combine scanned copies of biodata page (i.e., page stating your name, date of birth, passport number, passport issue and expiry date, etc.) and ALL marked/stamped/visa pages of passport in a single PDF file

If there is no entry stamp in your passport on your most recent entry into Canada, include copy of your flight itinerary/air ticket/boarding pass for the most recent entry into Canada, and write and include a simple Explanation Letter explaining the reason for including your flight itinerary

4. Client information

In addition, a **letter of explanation** stating why you need to apply for a study permit extension and a Co-op work permit would be helpful. For example, you switched programs and the new program has a mandatory practicum, that's why you need to apply for a Co-op work permit. It can be uploaded together with your **current study permit**. Please combine these three documents as a PDF Doc and upload as the document for **Client Information=Explanation letter + current study permit+ your Selkirk transcript**.


5. Mailing address

Please make sure your mailing address **won't change** when you are waiting for the new study permit and Co-op work permit. They will mail the two permits to you. OR if you move after you have submitted the application, you need update your mailing address with IRCC immediately through the webform: [Change my address – Immigration and citizenship - Canada.ca](https://www.cic.gc.ca/change-my-address)

Additional information:

 Biometrics (Fingerprint & Photo): If you have never submitted biometrics.

- **After applying, you must submit your biometrics** within 30 days of **receiving a Biometrics Instruction Letter.**
- **Book an appointment at the nearest biometrics collection site as soon as you receive this letter.**
- **The biometrics fee is CAD \$85, payable during application.**

Q&A:

What is a document number?

A document number appears on official immigration documents, such as study permits. It is usually printed in black ink and has a letter (an "F" for study permits) followed by 9 numbers.

How do I fill out the Details of my prospective employer section if I don't have a job?

Although you do not need a job offer to apply for a co-op work permit, you still must complete this section with the address of your co-op office (found on your co-op letter). You do not need to attach an offer of employment.

How do I answer Duration of expected employment?

Write "from" today's date and "to" the expiry date of your study permit.

How do I fill out the Education section?

Please note the question asks if you have had "any" post-secondary education, not if you have completed it. Since you are a student at Selkirk College, the answer to this should be "yes". Then you should provide details of "your highest level" of post-secondary education.

Once again, please note it does not say "completed", so you should type in your current studies, unless you have a higher level of education. Your "to" date should correspond with the month and year when you are applying.

You do not need to sign this form if applying online. Simply upload the form without signing. After uploading all your documents, you will later be asked to electronically sign your application by typing your name.

Do not print and sign the form because you will not be able to upload it to the site successfully.

Press the “**Validate**” button to ensure your application is complete. The validate button does not send any information to IRCC, so you can edit and validate as many times as you need. Any time after you update your form, you need to validate your form again.

If your study permit and work permit applications are approved, IRCC will mail you hard copies of the permits.
